




Parent Survey Results July 2023

The results of the survey are from the 47 responses received of our 125 families.

What suggestions do you have that would help us improve Fairfields further?

- Bring back swimming, remove collection of kids from carpark, allow collection from classes again
- Chance for all children to swim regularly. More notice of date of events
- Encourage more outside trips if affordable as my son really enjoyed the different experiences he has had while being at Fairfield's
- Nothing needs improving.

- More workshops, holiday activities or events to take pressure off parents and to help children maintain familiarity with school.
- More pictures and details about child's school day on parent app. It can be very sporadic with no great detail or explanation on the pic. After school clubs for the kids would be amazing!
- Like to know more or see more evidence on what the child gets up to. The Evidence Family doesn't get updated that often.
- Extend the school to take pupils into their upper school.

- It would make a huge difference to the lives of families if there was a holiday club of some sort offered at Fairfields by the staff that the children already know and in an environment they're comfortable in. I do understand however that this isn't due to Fairfields not offering it it's due to the government having removed funding. However this would be life changing for families. I don't feel able to send my son to any of the holiday activities offered with the HAF codes, however I know I could send him to a holiday club at Fairfields and it would help him transition over the summer break.

The other thing that I think would be nice would be for parents to have an opportunity to meet all the staff briefly, so that we can have an overall picture of everyone who may come in to contact with our children and then when our children move to a new class we are already aware of the staff.

- More advanced communication concerning strike days if any more occur.
- More notice of strike action. A regular working swimming pool. VR Therapy School finishing times, finish 15 minutes earlier or later, so don't have to deal with the traffic issues and road rages on trinity avenue each day. Possibility of holiday run summer camps
- We really miss the swimming pool being open but I fully understand the issues that have been causing this!
- My suggestion is simple, please keep doing what you are doing, Dear Teachers in All Staff your work really deserves attention and respect. Thank you.

- Increase more days and time on speech therapy to non verbal kids

 I also think it would be incredible if Fairfields did some training for mainstream schools on how to support children. It's is absolutely shocking the difference in knowledge and understanding. I feel so happy dropping my son off to school at Fairfields and so sad dropping my daughter at mainstream, because I would love her to be in an environment that understands her as much as Fairfields understands my son.
- I would love to see a nursery back (I know there was one previous) as it's hard when you know you have a special needs child but cannot access support at the early levels
- More detailed with handling every child and their belongings.
 Also, ensuring the kids are feed in school no matter how slow or difficult it might seem.
- Just keep doing what you do
- More regular visits from specialists, such as speech therapists
- More teaching about local history or maybe trips to Northampton museum if feasible
- Most likely there will be new things that will help facilitate the work at school.
- Keep doing what you're doing
- Wrap around care and holiday clubs would be amazing.
- Investment in upgrading classrooms to become more modern and technologically up to date for the children to access iPad type wireless educational apps etc.
- More access to learning. OT input for all children. A fully functioning pool that all children can access. Forest school to be part of the curriculum. Better school trips and more of them. Reading pens for children that can comprehend words but can't read.
